After a few years' hiatus, Priory Farm Aviators are back in the business of building kitplanes. Sue and Steve Foreman are assembling a Zenair CH601HDS at home in Kenninghall, and the aircraft is now

home in Kenninghall, and the aircraft is now recognisable—as the accompanying picture clearly shows. If all continues to proceed well, the aircraft should be flying from Priory Farm later this year.



The Zenair was registered G-CLZA as recently as 4 January and is the fourth to be built by our prolific husband-and-wife team. They started off with a Rans S-6 Coyote, then transferred allegiance to Zenair for a CH601HD, moving on in 2015 to their current mount, the blue CH701 G-CIXS. The earlier CH601, G-CDDS (registered in 2004), had a second period of residence at Priory Farm in the hands of David Hunter, but was sold to a gentleman as Tatenhill last October (correcting last month's residents' listing).
