CAA Rule change for overseas trips

Those of you who indulge in such adventurous activities as 'going abroad', will be familiar with the need to file a GAR (General Aviation Report) form prior to your return to the UK. This is so Border Force get advanced warning of your arrival so they can arrive at your destination airfield in the UK to check you are who you say you are, whether you are carrying people who shouldn't be there, or contraband you shouldn't have!! All familiar stuff.

Well, this rule is changing on 6th April. It's too complex to go into here but I will attach the CAA Guidance Document to the Waypoint distribution email for you to have a read.

Committee Meeting Minutes

Held at the Crown, Burston, 6th March 2024

Chaired by Alan McNeal (in David Brown's absence).

Present: Alan McNeal, Bob Sage, Mik Horne, Sean Simington, Maurice Edwards,

Apologies from: David Brown, John Fielding, Julian Campbell, Nigel Hall.

- 1. Previous minutes: The meeting accepted the minutes from February 2024 as being accurate.
- 2. 2024 Flying calendar: The Father's Day fly-in date will be 16th June (Father's Day). The possibility of holding the event on Father's Day limiting those fathers who might be unable to attend was discussed. The general consensus was that although this might be true to some extent, there was no real evidence to support it and that selecting another day may conflict with other events that could affect visitor numbers to a greater extent, so the selection of 16th June was accepted as in many previous years.

ATC Squadrons: Sean suggested we make contact with a local Air Training Cadet squadron to ask if they would like an association with PF, with a view to providing airfield contact opportunities for them and possible help at events & open days. This was generally thought to be a good idea. Sean has a contact who is involved with the ATC locally, so will talk to him. Otherwise, local ATC squadrons will be contacted to discuss this with them.

Fly-in Flyer & Promotion: Paul Jackson has offered to produce a promotional flyer for Father's Day fly-in (as in past years), subject to his being provided with the relevant information & pictures, which should include ballooning pictures to cover the planned launches in the early morning and evening, which hopefully will attract people to watch. Any conflict between fixed wing & rotary aircraft and balloons was felt to be unlikely, but could be managed by the duty radio operator and ground staff using walkie-talkie radios. Alan said he had most of the pictures taken in 2024 and beforehand, so he would ensure Paul had what he needed.

Extra 'Open Days': The proposed idea of holding one or more 'open days' in spring and autumn was discussed and widely accepted as being a good one. (proposer D. Brown, seconder Alan McNeal). The key factor to make these days a success will be the provision of Tom Garnham's catering service to attract visitors beyond our normal ability to just offer tea & coffee. After general discussion it was agreed that a day in late April or early May could be selected. It was agreed that the rope barriers erected for the Father's Day event would not be necessary, except around the catering trailer for safety reasons.

If this proved a success, a second date later in the year could be added. As to visiting aircraft it was agreed that producing flyers similar to the Father's Day event was not necessary, but promotion on Facebook groups and possibly other aircraft clubs such as the Jodel club could be invited. Details of a plan for the initial day to be discussed via phone & email and at the next committee meeting as necessary. Bob Sage as airfield operator is on-board with this idea.

4. Facilities maintenance: Julian Campbell, (our new facilities committee member) reported that the exterior of the clubhouse and decking are showing signs of mould growth., AM said he had a pressure sprayer and pressure washer that could be used as required. The tables & chairs are also to be cleaned at that time. There is some chemical spray concentrate remaining from previous years. This quantity should be checked for sufficiency when the worst of the wet season is passed (if ever!).

Julian Campbell also reported that the smoke alarm was 'beeping' but this was rectified by removing & replacing the newly installed battery.

- 5. Pylons update: Nothing new to report except that some ground works along the proposed route seem to have started, so the general view was that this pylons line will be built regardless of consultations & objections. The situation will continue to be monitored by D. Brown.
- 6. Marham Drone Recovery airspace changes: A recent document summarising the latest asd seemingly final plans has been received by David Brown. This will be distributed to all members by email. It was agreed that these plans should not adversely affect our pilots but they should be aware.
- 7. Membership: No recent changes. Mik Horne has produced a membership spreadsheet from Bob's written records, showing those who have paid their subs and who are still outstanding. Mik agreed to add contact information, groups membership and aircraft flown to the list for committee members only. Bob will follow up as required.on overdue subscriptions.
- 8. New members: DB had suggested that new members could get a 'welcome' on our social media pages. No objections were recorded to this.
- 8a. Finances: The Treasurer produced the latest financial report which shows a healthy financial position similar to previous statements. This statement can be obtained by any committee member on request to Mik Horne.
- 9. Website updates: No information so item deferred.
- 10. Waypoint: Alan & David suggested articles featuring individual PFA members. All agreed this was a good idea. Alan suggested Bob Sage's aviation history would make a good start. Bob did not object! Alan has a short list of other members who's profiles would make interesting articles. Alan to follow up.
